COVID-19 Changes for EHS

- Deemed an essential service
- Closed to general public access and in person-training
- Operating by appointment
 - Adoptions, Admitting, PALS, Virtual Training (CEC & Humane Education)
- Animals in our care go through the same process

Admitting	Modified	Limited intake of animals by appointment dependent on availability, including: emergencies, surrenders, and healthy stray dogs and small animals (found outside Edmonton). For information on surrendering a pet, click here. For emergencies or strays found outside Edmonton, call 780-491-3522 .
Adoptions	Modified	 Online adoption process with meet-and-greet by appointment. Cats & Small Animals – virtual meet-and-greet and curbside pick-up. Dogs – outdoor meet-and-greet (masks required). Click here for details.
Bingo's Pet Shop	Temporarily Closed	Closed as of Saturday, December 12. Re-opening date TBD.
Central Bark Off-Leash Dog Park	Temporarily Closed	Closed as of Wednesday, November 24. Re-opening date TBD.
Cremations	Modified	By appointment only. Click here for details.
Doggie Daycare	Permanent Closed	Closed as of Friday, January 8.



PALS Program

- Reducing homeless pet population to those with financial barriers
 - Only Administration cost for spay or neuter \$25/cat and \$50/dog
 - Includes one set of vaccines and microchip
- High Demand Program
- Supported by COE & Petsmart
- as of March 2021 this program has spayed/neutered 3948 animals









Trap Neuter Release

- Targets feral cats just outside Edmonton city limits to reduce cat overpopulation
- Free Program, supported by donations
- Standards and application on website animals are brought to EHS for sterilization, identification (ear notch+tattoo), vaccines, and parasite treatment if needed then returned to where they resided



Behaviour Resources

- Free for PDFs for download
- Developed by our Animal Welfare Advisor in consultation with Medical, Behaviour, other divisions, and reputable/trusted organizations (CVMA, AVMA, Fear Free Pets, etc.)
- Supporting community pet guardians and care providers with basic information and guidance for some of the companion animals we most commonly care for.


